GP Updates for South Seattle College & Seattle Colleges

<u>Pillar Committees</u>: The Guiding Team is organized into <u>Pillar Committees</u>. Each committee (*Clarify the Path, Help Students Choose & Enter a Path, Help Students Stay on the Path,* and *Ensure Students are Learning*), has two leads and is developing a work plan to tackle Guided Pathway redesigns associated with their Pillar. Their efforts will be focused on meeting the goals set out by the College Spark grant, tracking the work and identifying what work needs to be done, and engaging the campus around the work of their Pillar Committee. - **R<u>FP (Request For Proposal) Committee</u>**: Kurt Buttleman, Interim Vice Chancellor of Academic & Student Success for Seattle Colleges, in collaboration with Rosie Rimando-Chareunsap, VPSS at South, have established a district-wide committee to asses our current student support technology, identify gaps, and draft a request for proposal. The intended outcome is to identify and adopt a new suite of student support and retention technologies across the District that will help support our Guided Pathways goals.
- <u>Meta-Majors</u>: The Guiding Team is set to finalize a recommendation of meta-majors and forward them to the Chancellor's Executive Cabinet (CEC). Each college will send their versions of meta-majors and the CEC will make a recommendation for District Wide meta-majors. As a reminder, meta-majors are basically defined as a grouping of academic programs often times with shared courses that provide students with a clear pathway to graduation and connections between their studies and career destinations.
- <u>Program Maps</u>: Instruction and student services continue to collaborate in developing program maps that will help students find a clear pathway and stay on that path. Many are ready for final review and we are on track to roll out approved program maps for student use Fall Quarter 2018.

GP Updates at the National Level

- The Center for Community College Student Engagement recently released its newest national report, *Show Me the Way: The Power of Advising in Community Colleges*. With survey findings collected from over 130,000 community college students across 282 institutions, the report confirms that students who receive more advising—more time with advisors and more in-depth discussions in their sessions—are more engaged. The findings fall right in line with robust advising being an important piece in the Guided Pathways experience for our students.
