XIII. Fund for Education Abroad (FEA)

FEA scholarships were designed by professionals in the field of Education Abroad to meet the growing need for financial resources to enable more students to go abroad. Scholarships will be up to \$5,000 per semester and are not limited to specific programs, destinations, or fields of study. FEA will award funds for students planning to study abroad on academically rigorous programs with a preference for underrepresented students. The deadline for FEA scholarship applications is in November.

XIV. John Petters Foundation Scholarship

This scholarship is for undergraduate college students who are pursuing a degree in an accredited college or university in the United States. The applicants must have applied, or is applying for a study abroad program, which can be credited by the educational institution where the student is presently enrolled. To qualify, the applicant must need financial assistance, and intends to pursue a study abroad program that is related to international business. Only US citizens are eligible to apply
