*HOW TO APPLY FOR A JOB WITH A CONVICTION HISTORY - Finding a job with a criminal history can be an intimidating process. Through this workshop we will practice skill sets that can help make it a smoother, more successful process. We will begin by discussing how to build an effective resume, where to look for employment, how to apply to jobs, and practice interview skills. In addition, we will also look at what resources are available in the King County area that can assist in mitigating barriers to employment and how to navigate them. Resources include transportation assistance, transitional housing assistance, public benefits assistance, etc.

*<u>CREATING A LINKEDIN PROFILE</u> – LinkedIn is a powerful professional networking tool that can help you research career pathways, connect with people doing the kind of work that interests you, and learn about job opportunities. This workshop will introduce you to the basics of building a professional and compelling profile.
