

Housing Support - We offer different forms of housing/rental assistance, you must schedule an appointment with a [Benefits Hub Coach](#) to receive assistance.

Setting expectations:

- We will need to do a household budget to complete a housing support application.
- You must follow through with a Housing Support Specialist appointment with Neighborhood House to get help with move in costs.

Program 1:

Eligibility:

- Enrolled in 6 credits or more OR be degree-seeking at a Benefits Hub partner college OR transferring a degree from another country
- Behind on rent OR behind on mortgage OR located a new place to live
- Demonstrate financial need: have a monthly household income below 80% Area Median Income OR be impacted by COVID-19
- Have NOT already received housing support funds this quarter

Program 2:

COVID Rental Assistance (King County Program):

Eligibility:

- Available to anyone living in King County
- Behind on rent
- Experiencing housing instability
- Demonstrate financial need: have a monthly income below 50% Area Median Income
