Community Resources:

- 2-1-1 provides emergency assistance for housing and other needs (including Covid-19 related needs). 211's direct line should be 2-1-1. Usually this goes to a local provider. If you were connected with someone that only serves Issaquah, you can ask to be transferred to a service provider in King County. Also, if you are not having much luck with that line, you can call 877-211-9274. This number also goes to 211 but I believe you will get connected to someone that serves the broader state of Washington. Another line you can call is Washington Listens.
