

Program Map: English as a Second Language

South Seattle Transitional Studies Division offers English Language classes and Adult Basic Education Classes. English Language classes assist students in reaching life-skill goals including college courses and job training. Students in this pathway develop skills in verbal and written communication, critical thinking, multicultural awareness, computer skills, and career and college readiness skills.

There are six levels of English Language classes. English Language classes are 12 hours per week, Monday through Thursday. Classes are offered at three sites: South Seattle College's main campus in West Seattle, Georgetown campus, and NewHolly campus.

English Language morning classes are 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., and evening classes are 6:00 to 9:00 p.m.

Which Quarter Can I Begin?

The program accepts new students (starts) every quarter (Fall, Winter, Spring, Summer).

To Get Started

- To start, sign up for a placement testing session to enroll or by contacting the Transitional Studies office.
- After signing up, attend the testing session and request a Chromebook or hotspot if needed.
- Check email frequently for a placement email with the class level.
- Start attending classes.
- Activate your ctcLink EMPLID and MySeattleColleges login.
- Explore campus immigrant resources.
- Pay \$25 tuition in the college Registration Office or request a waiver from the Transitional Studies office.

Every Quarter

- Pay \$25 tuition in the college Registration Office in RSB 40 or request a waiver from the Transitional Studies office.
- Visit the SCC Library and locate the computer lab and ESL reading section.
- Visit the WELL (Writing and English Language Learning) tutors in RSB 16.
- Buy a parking pass or bus pass in the Registration Office in RSB 40 if needed.
