Students in the GED pathway develop skills in verbal and written communication, mathematical reasoning, science, and technology. They prepare to take and pass the four tests to earn their GED. Completion of the GED prepares students to transition to college studies and/or the workforce.

Before You Start

- Complete a Transitional Studies application.
- Transitional Studies staff will contact you to register for orientation week.
- During the orientation week you will do placement testing, activate your ctcLink ID and will be enrolled in classes.
