Day of Remembrance - February 19

On February 19, 1942, during WWII, President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed Executive Order 9066 to prevent espionage.

This caused the forced removal and mass incarceration of Americans of Japanese ancestry on the West Coast. Day of Remembrance commemorates the 120,000 Japanese Americans who were sent to concentration camps and one of the biggest violations of civil liberties in American history.
