### **USA Fall Quarter Programs**

The end of October was full of celebration. Our DEI Officer, Fella Bryant, hosted a movie night for Dia De Los Muertos while our Sustainability Officer, Leila, was joined by our Issues and Concerns officer, Khang, at the Food Lifeline Volunteer Project - and they sorted a literal ton of apples with a Microsoft employee volunteer team. All to support members of the community in-need. In addition, PTK and USA officers held an open mic for students on Nov. 19th. USA VP Hussen Nurhussen is also working on the annual Legislative Advocacy Day during winter quarter.
