- (Tentative) Math & English Faculty Request to Participate in Placement Reorganization Process
 - Review Tish Lopez' letter to South VP's
 - Tish was unable to attend today, but may want to speak on this at a future time.
 - Strategic Budget Reduction & Future Planning Task Force
 - Larry & Mac had meeting on 6/8
 - o Review District budget reduction strategies and ask for additional strategies
 - We are looking at cubs of \$6.6 million. The cuts that we need to make are about 25% of our total budget.
 - Dieny: I don't think that we can give suggestions unless we know the cost-benefit analysis for each of these strategies.
 - Larry: That is our feeling as well. We don't have the information about how this looks and what it is going to mean.
 - Jaime: What do 12, 22, 23, and 24 mean? I think that some sort of



definition of what these mean would be helpful to make a decision.

- Dieny: We need to look at longterm impacts of cutting programs that are currently low enrolled but we are known for throughout the area.
- Jane: BTS is known for transitioning students to college level credits and we are finding more and more that we are sending them off to other colleges because we have so few options.
- Larry: We put this in front of this council knowing that we do not have time to go line by line of this. I think we need to give a message about what we feel needs to be prioritized in the budget reductions.
- Ballot box
 - Meeting with President Rosie, Julienne D., James L., Monica L. on 6/10
 - King County wants to put the ballot box in front of RSB, near the bus stop. This
 is the only spot they are willing to place a box on our campus, but this results in
 security concerns with access to the South parking lot on campus. Rosie
 suggested that maybe we put a our security trucks to block access to that area of
 campus. It looks like that was accepted and it looks like we will have a ballot
 box prior to November's election.
- District Council
 - Next Steps: Ideas to tackle issues affecting entire District
 - Mac and Larry met with North and Central College Council leaders and discussed what they want to focus on as priorities for a District Council. That being said, we still need a co-chair for next year. They will be a part of meetings with Rosie, the District Council, and other priorities.
 - Ideas: Social justice mural project
 - Mac: If anyone has ideas, please reach out.
- Transportation Task Force
 - Meeting on 6/30

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- Bus 128 stops about a mile away from campus now, though it will return to campus when we reopen. Rosie has been talking with shuttle bus companies to pick up students somewhere in West Seattle and downtown to take students to campus. This is a service for students impacted by the West Seattle bridge closure but maybe also a pay-for-service for other West Seattle residents.
- Faculty & Staff Resource Guide
 - Group met on 6/15
 - A group has been meeting to put together this resource guide.
 - Larry: Has there been discussion about who will be maintaining this?
 - Mac: I put a link to the College Council email address. Do you think this should be forwarded to PIO as well?
 - Larry: I think it makes sense to have College Council filter and make sure that it is solid information before publishing it online.
- Collaboration with Labor Education & Research Center on student workers –Larry
 - Adjusting for COVID-19 crisis
 - Coordination with Institutional Research
 - Larry: We were hoping to get that out by the end of Spring quarter. I am not sure whether that is going to happen.
- Additional Council priorities for 2019-2020
 - Pedestrian safety on 16th Ave SW/Traffic Calming
 - "You Otter Slow Down" signage
 - Your Voice, Your Choice Campaign Mac: We were having issues with people speeding down 16th. The City has a spot where we can suggest improvements. We suggested



lights or speed bumps in front of our bus stops but we did not get enough votes for that. In place of those, we were thinking of putting signs up.

Jennifer: What about painting the street?

Larry: I think that would be great.

Jen: I know that there is visibility with trees in that area. I understand that we would need to plant a tree somewhere else to make up for it.
