# Pathway: Humanities & Culture



## About the Humanities & Culture Pathway

This pathway is designed to meet Associate in Arts degree requirements with an emphasis in Humanities & Culture. This pathway is designed to allow students to pursue careers in the global and national non-profit sector, media production, human resources, education, public policy, and advertising. Students pursuing this degree combine the study of language, film and media studies, popular culture, literatures, multicultural and diversity studies, and philosophy.

The Humanities & Culture pathway examines the common issues, ideas, and themes that run throughout diverse cultures and human history. In the Humanities & Culture pathway, students analyze issues such as race, gender, and class in relation to popular culture, global movements, and social justice. As a humanities student, you'll gain the ability to reason critically, research and communicate effectively, and make connections across broad fields of knowledge related to culture, power, and identity.

### Length of Program

90 credits = 6 quarters if you take 15 credits\* each term.

*\*Students who take 15 credits each quarter earn their degree faster, qualify for more financial aid, and earn more money over their lifetime because they complete their schooling faster.*

### Which Quarter Can I Begin?

Fall, Winter, Spring, or Summer.

### Class Times/Delivery Format?

Classes and labs are offered M-TH (2 days or 4- days a week) from 8am-4pm and in the evenings. We offer on-campus, online, or hybrid (part on-campus, part online) formats.
