



Wonderlic Basic Skills Test for Math (WBST-M)

The Wonderlic Math Placement test is a 20 minute, timed, 45 multiple choice question test on the computer. See below table for placement.

Important information to know before practicing:

- The Wonderlic test has a 20 minute time limit (accommodations are available through the [Disability Services Office](#))
- Calculators are provided for you
- There are 45 multiple choice questions in the test
- One retake is allowed however you will have to pay a 2nd fee of \$25
- Your score is valid for 2 years

- While you take the practice test, we recommend timing yourself at least one time (20 minutes) as the test you will be taking in the Student Assessment Office will have a 20 minute time limit.
- While you take the practice test, we recommend using a calculator as you will be allowed to use a calculator on the test you will be taking in the Student Assessment Office.
- There are four possible answers for each question, but only one is correct. Your score is based on the number of questions you answered correctly. If you think you know the answer, but are uncertain, select that answer and move on to the next question.
- You do not have to answer all 45 questions, however you should try to answer as many as possible.
- In the official test, you will be able to review your answers if you have time at the end.

WBST-M Placement

Score*	Placement
0-200 (50% or less)	Referral to Adult Basic Education classes
205-270 (50-65%)	MATH 080, MATH 081, MATH 083, MATH 110, BUS 116
275-500* (65-100%)	MATH 091, MATH 094, MATH 111
*Students who earn a score of 315+ (a score of 75%) will be eligible to proceed to the Advanced test for a higher level placement	

***Please note:** the percentages are approximate and only intended for students to use while grading themselves on practice exams. For Placement, non-percentage placement scores are used. Wonderlic is scored based on a scaled score so all percentages are approximate.
