Message from the President and Foundation Chair

Dear Friends,

Each fall, thousands of students decide to take control of their future by beginning or continuing their education at South Seattle College. We are continually inspired by the tenacity and talent of our students, and by the incredible faculty and staff members who support and encourage them along the way.

South Seattle College is known for being one of the most diverse colleges in the country. We are also known for academic rigor and an environment that challenges students to be their best selves. Two students who embody these qualities are Austin Tugade and Musa Abdi, who were recently invited to join the All-Washington Academic Team, which honors community and technical college students with outstanding records in academics and community service. Like many students at South, Austin and Musa have overcome significant barriers to continue their education. While many community colleges across the country confront challenges related to student retention and completion, South students are succeeding by completing their programs and entering the workforce in high-demand fields or transferring to four-year universities of their choice. In fact, South students who transfer to four-year universities succeed at higher rates than those who enroll directly in four-year universities. Similarly, we saw a 17% increase in graduation rates at South Seattle College in 2016.

This progress did not happen overnight. It is the result of a dedicated team and engaged community of supporters who know that when given the opportunity and means to succeed, South students are unstoppable! By supporting our students from enrollment to graduation and beyond, we are making great strides in increasing student success.

We know that affordable and quality education intercepts cycles of poverty. South Seattle College Foundation scholarships enable talented students, like Austin and Musa, to continue their education despite financial hardships. In 2015, we awarded scholarships to 336 students – a new record! And we’ve recently confirmed what we’ve suspected all along: Students who receive scholarships are about three times more likely to complete college than students without scholarships. Your investment in student success is paying off for our community. Here at South, we have a lot to be proud of, and we are working each day to strengthen our programs and cater to the evolving needs of our students and the workforce they will soon enter. We invite you to share South’s successes with friends, colleagues, and family. Let them know that South offers academic programs that position students to transfer to the college of their choice, real-world professional/technical programs that lead to well-paying jobs, and three Bachelor of Applied Science programs whose students graduate ready to advance their careers. Our comprehensive programs serve a multicultural population of around 15,000 students a year.

Looking Back on a Great Year...



Celebrating the Class of 2016

South Seattle College's Class of 2016 graduates were honored at the 46th Annual Commencement Ceremony held on June 16 at Benaroya Hall. Over 900 graduates were celebrated, and they moved into their future with a vast array of degrees, certificates and diplomas in hand, prepared to enter the workforce or continue their education.

South Seattle College conferred a total of 921 awards this year, including 463 associate transfer degrees that enable students to transfer to four-year colleges and universities in Washington and beyond to complete their bachelor's degrees. Another 277 graduates earned associate degrees and certificates that prepare them to enter the workforce immediately. Forty-nine earned their bachelor's degrees, including the first class to obtain a Bachelor's of Applied Science in Sustainable Building Science Technology, and 132 graduates earned their high school diploma or equivalent, taking a significant step toward increased earning potential and future educational opportunities.

South Joins Forces with Colleges Nationally to Improve Student Success

South Seattle College is on the forefront of implementing innovative ways to help our students choose a program that fits their passion and skills, and leads to fulfilling careers or successful transfer to a four-year university.

In October of 2015, South was one of only 30 colleges across the nation selected to participate in the American Association of Community Colleges Pathways Project. We will spend the next 2.5 years working with the other colleges to create a national "Guided Pathways" approach to higher education. Guided Pathways is defined by the belief that students will be able to complete their credential more quickly and easily if they choose a program and develop an academic plan early on, have a clear roadmap of courses and are supported from enrollment through graduation and beyond with robust student services. There is growing evidence that suggests this strategy is effective in increasing college completion and transfer rates, and narrowing completion gaps for a diverse range of students.

More recently, in July of 2016, South was one of five Washington colleges awarded a five-year grant from College Spark Washington and the Washington State Board of Community and Technical Colleges to become statewide leaders in implementing Guided Pathways.

\$4.8 Million Apprenticeship Grant to Help South Expand Adult Training

In amazing news for South's work with apprentices in Washington State, the college was awarded a \$4.8 million grant from the federal Department of Labor as part of the American Apprenticeship Initiative Grant Program. The grant will fund the public/private Partnership for Advanced Technology Apprenticeships in Manufacturing and Marine Engineering, creating and expanding adult training programs that will serve at least 1,000 workers in the state and over 300 workers from underrepresented populations. This is just the latest example of South's steadfast work in connecting with industry to develop new apprenticeship opportunities in emerging areas.

South Ranked a Top-25 Community College in the Nation in Recent Study

WalletHub, an online service that ranks many economic sectors for value, recently released a study that ranked South Seattle College as the 23rd best community college in the U.S. based on cost and finance, classroom experience, education outcomes and career outcomes. The study pulled data from several national databases and compared over 670 community colleges. Our highest ranking of the four categories was in career outcomes, which falls perfectly in line with South's motto of *"Start Here, Go Anywhere!"*

New Aviation Program Helps Veterans Transition into Civilian Careers

This past academic year, South's Aviation Maintenance Program and Veteran Transition Specialist launched a training program with partners from Joint Base Lewis-McChord and the local aerospace industry to assist the transition of military aircraft mechanics out of service and into employment in the civilian aviation industry. We are proud to have these service members as our students, and are glad to play a supportive role in their transition back to civilian life. The program has caught the attention of U.S. Armed Forces leadership, and in May of 2016 we had the honor of presenting the "nuts and bolts" of the program to Chief Master Sergeant James A. Cody of the Air Force (the highest enlisted level of leadership).

Musa Abdi

Recipient of the Wyckoff Allied Health Adopt-A-Student Scholarship

Musa began his academic career at South in 2014 through the 13th Year Promise Scholarship, but his passion to thrive in medicine is rooted in his childhood. Musa was born in Ethiopia, but after his father died in the Ethiopian Civil War, his mother was forced to move her six children to a Kenyan refugee camp, where they lived for the next fifteen years. Musa describes observing shortages in "basic necessities of human well-being," during his time in the camp, and vowed to do his part to change that. He has used his difficult childhood as motivation to be the first in his family to attend college, participates in medical and dental summer programs through the University of Washington, and goes above and beyond as a math and science tutor and member of the All-Washington Academic Team. Once he completes his associate degree at South, Musa plans to continue his education and become a pharmacist to help families in crisis connect with the medications they need. Receiving a scholarship from the South Seattle College Foundation has brought Musa one step closer to that goal.

13th Year PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP

Dulce Saucedo
 Recipient of the 13th Year Promise Scholarship
 When Dulce Saucedo graduated from Chief Sealth International High School and enrolled at South Seattle College, she became the first in her family to complete high school and enroll in college. While a tremendous feat in itself, it's not the only obstacle she has overcome. When Dulce was 14 years old, she was diagnosed with brain cancer. The diagnosis terrified and shocked Dulce and her family, and caused her to question whether her dream of being a doctor would ever happen. Since the initial discovery and diagnosis, Dulce had a successful surgery, and has since been declared cancer-free. Dulce is now more motivated than ever to continue studying medical science, and plans to focus her studies and career on cancer research and treatment.

Innovation in College Access

The 13th Year Promise Scholarship is an innovative program that guarantees every graduate from Cleveland, Chief Sealth International, and Rainier Beach high schools the opportunity to attend South Seattle College for their first year, tuition free. Students in this program receive specialized orientations, mentorship, and academic support to help them succeed.

Background

The 13th Year Promise Scholarship is based on research from the Washington State Board for Community and Technical Colleges, which found that even one year of college often becomes a "tipping point" for students to continue their education and earn a living wage. This scholarship opportunity was created to give students who may not have otherwise attended college access to higher education.

The scholarship began with the Cleveland High School Class of 2008; in 2011 the program expanded to include Chief Sealth International High School, and the Readiness Academy was created to help students prepare for and succeed in college. In 2013, the 13th Year Promise Scholarship expanded to Rainier Beach High School.



Biella Foundation Makes Exceptional Gift

Since 2010, Kirkland-based Biella Foundation has generously supported the South Seattle College Foundation, and through that experience became inspired by the role of Washington's community and technical colleges in providing an affordable, accessible education to all Washingtonians. That inspiration led to an exceptional gift from Biella: a \$340,000 donation dispersed to all 34 community colleges in Washington.
