

Goals of the Institute

The goal of the institute is to enhance our efforts to better understand ourselves so that we can establish a shared vision of how we will work more effectively with our co-workers and diverse student population. We will focus on deepening our knowledge of cultural competence, oppression and equity.

Outcomes

The participants will become a learning community, who will become "coaches". This group will receive quarterly training and will set a goal of how that knowledge will be passed onto our colleagues through division and/or department meetings throughout the year. The quarterly meetings will provide a means for us to better infuse diversity into our work (as noted during accreditation) and address institutionalization of a professional development activity.

Training Objectives

Participants from South will build knowledge of:

- common language of equity and inclusion;
- historical frameworks that shape the dynamics of power, privilege and oppression;
- how power, privilege and oppression dynamics shape student learning processes and experiences at South;
- how power, privilege and oppression dynamics shape work relationships and environments at South;
- strategies for interrupting systems of oppression, developing equity practices, and creating inclusive learning and work environments; and more.

Cost

- 3 days with full release time (grant team will work with unit administration to cover staff and instructional needs for participants)
- limited to 30 participants (a campus-wide learning community that consists of 10 classified, 10 exempt, and 10 faculty per Cabinet guidelines)
- mileage, food and lodging fully supported by the grant
