COURSE DESCRIPTION:

A highly interactive course that develops basic communicative proficiency in listening, reading, speaking and writing in Spanish. Students explore and employ several communicative strategies which enhance self-expression and comprehension in the target language. The required text book, listening materials, films as well as other supplemental materials compliment this approach to learning. Cultural, historical, economic, environmental and socio-political issues relevant to the Spanish speaking world are an integral part of this course.

- 1. Communication Explore and employ of several communicative strategies which enhance self-expression and comprehension in the target language. Speak and write effectively for personal, academic and career purposes.
- Computation Learn about the application of mathematical symbols throughout the Spanish speaking world (decimals and commas with monetary units, systems of measurements, reference to time, etc.). Use arithmetic and other basic mathematical operations to calculate one's grades.
- Human Relations Apply appropriate social interactive skills to work in groups effectively. Recognize and respect the diversity of cultural influences and values. Actively engage in all in-class exercises to enhance comprehension and personal expression.
- 4. Critical Thinking Think critically in evaluating information, solving problems and making decisions
- 5. Personal Responsibility Be motivated, actively engaged in all aspects of the course. Value one's own skills, abilities, ideas and contributions to the learning environment. Share insights and learning strategies with others.
- Information Literacy Access and evaluate information about a wide range of cultural, historical, political and socio-economic issues from a variety of sources and contexts, including technology.

GENERAL COURSE OBJECTIVES:

At the end of the course the student will be able to:

- 1. Comprehend both spoken and written Spanish in a variety of contexts.
- 2. Communicate in Spanish both orally and in writing using a variety of contexts Emphasis on mastery of oral fluency, as well as discussion and analysis of literature.
- Demonstrate a strong understanding of various conjugation patterns as well as other advanced grammatical structures fundamental to the target language, as well as idioms.
- 4. Express and comprehend several grammatical structures presented throughout the course.
- 5. Manipulate an active vocabulary of 3,000 4,000 words
- 6. Attain a passive vocabulary of 4,000 6,000 words
- 7. Critically reflect upon a variety of cultural, historical, economic, environmental and socio-political issues to the Spanish speaking world.
